

Coronado First Bank Second Quarter Earnings

Coronado, Calif. – Business Wire – July 24, 2012 – Maria P. Kunac, President and Chief Executive Officer of Coronado First Bank (OTCQB:NADO; OTCBB:NADO), announced today the bank’s earnings for Second Quarter 2012.

Based on unaudited financial results for the second quarter ended June 30, 2012, Coronado First Bank reported net profit of \$329,000 for the quarter and \$573,000 for the first half of 2012.

As of June 30, 2012 total assets were \$160 million and total deposits were \$120 million. The bank maintained very strong capital ratios finishing the quarter with a Tier 1 Leverage Capital Ratio of 16.58% and a Total Risk Weighted Capital Ratio of 23.83%. At June 30, 2012, the bank’s book value per share was \$10.77, an increase of \$0.22 per share from year end 2011.

Ms. Kunac stated, “We are very pleased to report these results for the first half of 2012 and credit our dedicated banking professionals who provide personalized service in this competitive environment.”

Coronado First Bank is publicly traded on the Over-the Counter Bulletin Board (OTCQB), ticker symbol: “NADO,” with total shares outstanding for Coronado First Bank stock of 2,598,895.
